
SUBJECT: Training and Employment Guidance Letter (TEGL)

- 1. Purpose.** This Directive transmits TEGL NO. 9-12:

10/24/12	Human Trafficking: The Role of the Public Workforce System in the Delivery of Services And Referrals to Victims of Trafficking
- 2. Discussion.** TEGL No. 9-12 provides information about workforce, training, and referral services to victims of human trafficking, including updated guidance on how to deliver services under the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (WIA), the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (TVPA) and the Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Acts of 2003, 2005 and 2008 (TVPRA).

The TEGL discusses specific ways that Workforce Agency (American Job Center) staff can assist trafficking victims, and identifies resources that are available to aid in providing benefits and services.
- 3. Action.** As pointed out in the TEGL, State Workforce Agency staff should become familiar with its content and follow the procedures outlined for working with the victims of trafficking. Please note the announcement of a forthcoming (no date given) training Webinar on *Trafficking in Persons Awareness*, and plan for appropriate staff to participate, where possible.
