The Port of Jackson is located on the Tennessee-Tombigbee waterway in southern Clarke County. The port is located at 500 River Park Drive. The City of Jackson formed the Port Authority of the City of Jackson to manage the port. The Authority was formed under the city's industrial development board. The Authority's purpose is providing ancillary port infrastructure to accommodate berthing, docking, terminal facilities, and transloading/temporary storage areas for industrial users requiring port-related facilities.

The berth at the port is in need of dredging. Dredging was last completed eight years ago. Sedimentation since the last dredging has necessitated dredging the berth again. By dredging the berth, the Port Authority can maintain the appropriate width and depth for enabling the safe, unobstructed passage of cargo. Without the dredging, operational problems and vessel groundings will occur.

Attachment A contains an aerial photo of the port with the area where the dredging will occur outlined.

Dredging of the berth is now essential. Sediment in the berth is causing safety concerns and limiting tonnage. The need for dredging is negatively affecting the city's marketing of the adjacent industrial site to prospects. Both of these concerns are affecting the City of Jackson's economy. The Port Authority will coordinate all work through the necessary regulatory agencies, including the Corps of Engineers. The project will be procured and implemented complying with all regulations.

The berth is in dire need of dredging, which restricts the port's tonnage significantly. As sedimentation continues, the berth will become unnavigable and dredging will be more costly. Currently, the need for dredging is posing safety risk for users and restricts the type/number of users.

The proposed project will enhance the regional competitiveness for port operators and users. The Jackson Port is the only port on the Tombigbee River between Demopolis and Mobile. The City of Jackson Port Authority manages the port, which is owned by the Jackson Industrial Development Board. Adjacent to the port is the Jackson River Road Industrial Site which has forty-four available acres. The port/site is in an enterprise zone which makes it desirable due to the availability of certain tax incentives to corporations, partnerships and proprietorships that locate or expand within designated areas. In recent years numerous industries, including wood pellet producers, have shown interest in the site. Dredging of the berth has been a significant obstacle to landing an industrial prospect at the port. Dredging the berth will enhance the economic competitiveness of the site and the area.

The Port Authority of the City of Jackson has both the technical and managerial capabilities to complete the proposed project within two years of the effective date of the grant award. The Port Authority is a subdivision of the city government. The city has successfully managed and implemented projects from programs including Community Development

Block Grant (CDBG), Delta Regional Authority States Economic Development Program (SEDAP), ALDOT Industrial Access, Transportation Enhancement, and numerous other programs. The city will follow its procurement procedures to implement the improvements. The city and Port Authority is audited each year by an independent auditor.

The proposed project consists of dredging the berth at the Port of Jackson. The project budget includes fees for engineering, permits, and dredging.

Matching funds will be provided by the Port Authority of the City of Jackson. Minutes from the Port Authority of the City of Jackson's November 7, 2019 meeting are included with this application. The minutes indicate that a motion passed authorizing applying for ADECA port grants up to \$350,000.00 and committing to a 20% match. Minutes from the Authority's December 9, 2019 meeting are also included, these minutes also indicate the Authority voted to commit a 20% match.

The City of Jackson Industrial Development Board in conjunction with the City of Jackson have approved the issue of bonds in the total amount of \$1,905,000.00. These funds will be used by the IDB to fund economic development projects and improvements.

The Authority has received \$120,000.00 in ADECA Inland Port First Round funding. This funding is being utilized to replace inoperable and obsolete barge tuggers at the port. The Authority committed to a 20% match for this project.
