

1. Does ADECA anticipate awarding project funds to subrecipient organizations (such as counties or municipalities) to implement their own projects? Or does ADECA anticipate that the state will implement programs or projects on an area-wide basis in the most-impacted geographical areas?

ADECA anticipates that the State will implement programs and projects on an area-wide basis in the most-impacted geographical areas.
2. Who will be providing the implementation services for the programs, such as intake, eligibility reviews, construction oversight, environmental review, construction?

Implementation services for the programs, such as intake, eligibility reviews, construction oversight, environmental review, construction will be provided on behalf of ADECA by the selected respondent as part of the contract entered into as a result of this RFP.
3. Are implementation services intended to be a part of this contract?

Yes.
4. Is ADECA anticipating any labor categories to be present on-site at ADECA offices or can the respondent perform services remotely?

The selected respondent will be contracted to perform these services remotely. The selected respondent's on-site presence at ADECA's office may be required intermittently for meetings/discussions, program updates, etc.
5. What is the total contract duration as the RFP indicates the initial contract will be less than 2 years, and also indicates a potential extension of the contract for another two-year period.

It is the policy of the Alabama Contract Review Legislative Oversight Committee to accept submission of contracts with a maximum term of up to two (2) years; however, State law permits the extension of these contracts for a period of up to five (5) years after the initial two (2) years.
6. Can ADECA provide a standard cost proposal sheet so that all respondents can provide consistent pricing?

No. Respondents are expected to develop and use their own forms when responding to this RFP. ADECA is permitted under State law to request clarification during the evaluation process, if needed.
7. The anticipated scope of work indicates "assistance with the development and management of information technology oversight for this CDBG-DR grant". Can you please provide additional information on this task?

This work would include the development and management of an electronic/computerized system of record that ADECA and the successful respondent/contractor can use to administer this program, both in the office and remotely from the disaster impacted areas.
8. How does ADECA intend to utilize the Mitigation funds?

This will be determined through program development and HUD's guidance throughout the program's implementation.
9. Is completion of the environmental reviews part of this scope of work? If yes, to obtain comparable pricing across responding consultants, can you please provide details on what should be priced?

Yes, completion of the environmental reviews is a part of the scope of work. The selected respondent/contractor will be required to complete a Part 58 HUD Environmental Review for all awarded projects under this disaster recovery program.
