

CDBG-DR Action Plan

- ADECA CDBG-DR Action Plan was approved by HUD on January 12, 2023, and contains:
 - Unmet Needs Analysis: Disaster recovery needs resulting from impacts of Hurricanes Sally and Zeta by sector (Housing, Infrastructure, Economy)
 - Programs and Funding: HRAP, LRP, Direct Allocations (HHMID) and Competition (MID)
 - Other HUD required components
- HUD Grant Agreement
 - Formally grants CDBG-DR funds to ADECA
 - Pending transmittal by HUD

Home Recovery Alabama Program (HRAP)

Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) Counties





HRAP Program Overview

- Directly Implemented by ADECA
- Limited to single family housing units, 1 to 4 units
- Provides up to \$350,000 per unit to repair, reconstruct or replace single family homes that suffered damage from one or both qualifying storms.

HRAP Budget	Amount
Owner Occupied (85%)	\$238M
Renter Occupied (15%)	\$42M
Total Program Budget	\$280M



Local Recovery Planning Program (LRPP)

Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) Counties





LRP Program Purpose

- Develop Local Recovery Plans (LRP) that:
 - Identify greatest impacts/unmet needs and the needs of hard to reach/vulnerable populations through local engagement
 - Allow MID counties to conduct a capacity assessment and develop an implementation plan to ensure subrecipients will have the capacity to implement proposed projects
 - Identify projects for CDBG-DR funding through the MID Competition that address immediate recovery needs while further positioning communities to pursue long-term mitigation actions at scale

MID and HHMID Pathways

Hardest Hit Most Impacted and Distressed (HHMID) Counties and City

Federally-designated MID Counties (and City) designated "Hardest Hit" by ADECA

Baldwin and Mobile Counties, and City of Mobile

Can fund programs and/or projects with their direct CDBG-DR allocation from ADECA

Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) Counties

Federally-designated and State-designated MID Counties



Competitive Programs Budget Breakdown


- Housing Competition

ACCA Role in LRPP

- In accordance with ADECA's CDBG-DR Action Plan, ADECA has selected the Association of County Commissions of Alabama (ACCA) to lead the MID LRP process
- ADECA will enter into a Subrecipient Agreement with ACCA, which will form a consortium with MID Counties





MID Planning Consortium

- The consortium will allow:
 - Quicker launch of LRP process and plan development
 - Identification of capacity gaps and development of implementation plans to improve MID County capacity
 - Uniform approach to planning efforts, unmet needs analysis and project identification
 - Level the playing field for MID Competition process



MID Planning Consortium

- ADECA and ACCA will ensure all MID Counties have equal and adequate representation in Consortium
- The consortium will be formed by ACCA and MID Counties by jointly entering into an intergovernmental agreement or other legal instrument
- MID Counties will be eligible to receive reimbursement for staff costs to participate in the consortium

LRP Components

- Assessment of Storm Impact
- Local Unmet Needs and Mitigation Assessment
- Robust Equitable Engagement
- Analysis and Creation of MID Recovery Zones
- Project Identification for MID Competition



LRP Review and Acceptance

- All MID Counties must individually present the LRP to its governing body before submittal to ADECA
- ACCA, on behalf of the MID Planning Consortium, must submit the LRP within nine (9) months after execution of the Subrecipient Agreement with ADECA
- ADECA will review the LRP within 60 days after submission
 - ADECA will accept if all criteria are met
 - Otherwise, ADECA will provide details of changes necessary to receive acceptance



MID Competitions

- Once the LRP is accepted by ADECA, all MID Counties will be eligible to submit projects identified in the LRP through a competitive process.
- There will be two competitive processes:
 - Housing activities (\$30M)
 - Non-housing activities (\$22M)
- Information on each competition is contained in the ADECA CDBG-DR Action Plan
- ADECA will provide more information as the guidelines processes are developed




LRP Timeline and Key Milestones

 - Other Requirements



ACCA Next Steps

- Complete Capacity Assessment
- Finalize Roles and Responsibilities and Scope of Work
- Execute Subrecipient Agreement

Administrative Systems

- ADECA is currently developing processes for Invoicing and Reporting
- Invoicing
 - Monthly
 - Reimbursement basis
- Reporting
 - Monthly progress reporting
 - Quarterly reporting
 - Section 3, Davis Bacon and other required reports



Next Steps: Dos

- MID Counties should:
 - Become familiar with the ADECA CDBG-DR Action Plan and Policies and Procedures (i.e., Subrecipient Manual)
 - Consider potential staff to support planning effort (POCs)
 - Begin to identify data sources for the Unmet Needs Assessment
 - Begin to identify stakeholders for consultation
 - Begin to identify impacts from the storm, including physical impacts and impacts to populations (i.e., vulnerable populations identified in the CDBG-DR Action Plan)
 - Keep any open line of communication with ADECA



Next Steps: Don'ts

- MID Counties should <u>not</u>:
 - Incur any costs
 - Commit any choice limiting actions
 - Procure any services or supplies/materials/equipment
 - Assume CDBG-DR funds can supplant other funding sources on existing and potential projects
