





- Curt Flood—Baseball player, instrumental in labor laws that led to free agency in professional sports

Flood Insurance, What's Trending?



- Refunds for overpayments began on October 1st. "Up to 1 million policy holders will begin receiving refunds" under the HFIAA.
- SW Florida recently named "Flood Insurance" as the number 1 issue in the region.
- Private Offerings for Flood Insurance are on the rise, particularly in FL.
- Increasing interest in Community Rating System.
- More scrutiny on Community Ordinances.




Flood Mapping, What's Trending?



- Risk MAP is ongoing, maps continually being updated.
- Funding levels have steadily been on the decline, focus recently has been on coastal mapping.
- Sen. Landrieu of Louisiana increased funding in FY2015 budget 16 million from FY2014.
 - Only 52% of our nation's flood maps are currently certified as accurate
 - FEMA estimates 4-10% will become not current every year going forward.
 - "we cannot make good decisions without good maps"


2013 Colorado Floods



- September 9th to 15th
- Front Range of Rockies
- Nearly a years worth of rain in one week ~ 20 inches
- 1000 year storm in some places, overall 100 year estimation.
- 10 deaths
- 19,000 homes damaged







2013 Sardinia Floods



- November 17th to 19th
- Mediterranean Island
- 17.3" of rain on Nov 19th
- 18 deaths
- 1 Billion Euro in Damage








2014 Eastern European Floods

- May 14th to 18th
- Serbia/Bosnia
- Heaviest Rain in 120 years
- 62 deaths
- Several Billion Euro in Damage
- 2,000 landslides
- 1.6 million adversely affected







June 2014 Afghan Floods



- June 7th Flash Flood
- Baghlan Region
- Over 200 dead
- 2,000 homes destroyed








August 2014 Long Island Floods



- August 12th and 13th
- 24 hour rain record in Islip, NY (13.57")
- 1 death
- 100's of homes damaged








September 2014 Phoenix Flood



- September 8th
- Wettest day ever recorded (3.29 inches); previous record 1939
- 2 deaths
- Interstate-10 closed
- Remnants of Hurricane Norbert








September 2014 India/Pakistan Flood



- September 2nd onward, heavy monsoon season
- Kashmir Region
- "Equivalent of Hurricane Katrina in Kashmir"
- Over 250 deaths
- Over 200,000 rescued
- 100,000 homes destroyed
- 17 billion in damages
- Estimated at 100 year recurrence interval
- Peak discharge of 100,000 CSF on Jhelum. Previous record high of 80,000 in 1928



Winter 2014 United Kingdom Flooding



- Highest January rainfalls in recorded history in Southern England
- Wettest overall winter on Record
- Highest Flows on Thames since 1974
- Highest winter runoff on Thames and Severn in recorded history
- 1 Billion British Pounds in damages







Baldwin County/Pensacola April 2014




- April 29th and 30th
- Upwards of 2 feet of rainfall
- Worst Flooding in 30 years
- Fish River in Baldwin County reached highest level ever 23.8'.
- 1 reported death





Historical Losses--NFIP






National Flood Insurance Program
